AGED OFFICE BOYS AT LAST.

Gray-Haired Men Satisfactorily Fill Places of Youngsters.

Enter the aged office boy, Gray-haired telegraph messengers have for years been a common sight in the city, but not until recently, when the shortage of office and errand boys became acute, have business houses, both big and small, harried by the lack of youngsters, resorted to the employment of elderly men in their stead.

"The head of one of the biggest printing and publishing houses in New York is now depending almost entirely upon elderly men for work in and out of the office previously done by boys.

"For a long time," said this man, "our company found it practically impossible to get the boys needed in our business. In talking over the matter with my wife, she suggested that the reason we could not get boys was probably due to the fact that, with increased wages and assured work, parents were now sending their boys to high school instead of sending them out to work after completing the grammar term, as so many have done in the past. After having tried for about a year, through every agency known to man, to obtain boys needed for our various departments, I finally had to agree with her.

"Then an idea came to me: Why not advertise for active elderly men to act as

An International Coin Suggested

Henry Clews, banker, makes an interesting suggestion in his weekly letter from New York. After the war, he says, "America, England, France and Germany ought to agree upon one international coin at least representing an equal amount and value in absolute gold, which will pass current in each nation alike; each country to have its own stamp upon all its issues. If it worked well, Japan, China, Russia, and other nations, if they so desired, could be admitted into the combination. This plan would make it easy for travelers going from one country to another." PULP WOOD OPERATORS BOOST WAGES OF MEN

Bangor Commercially

Woodmen will get higher wages this winter in the Maine woods than ever before, at least in recent years. From \$40 to \$45 a month will be the scale there last year \$30 and \$35 was paid. The Great Northern Paper Company, which paid \$1 a day last season is paying \$1.25 to \$1.35 this year for the same grade of woodmen. All the large companies are paying about the same while the small operators find it necessary to pay as high as \$45 a month.

Although the last year has been an extremely busy one with the local lumber mills, reports are to the effect that they will not increase their cut or purchases of logs this winter. The lumbermen say that they cannot compete with the pulp mills in buying spruce as the pulp mills are ready to pay whatever price is necessary to obtain the pulpwood. Each year the pulp mills get more of the spruce output than the year before and the coming season will not be an exception. Not a stick will come down the West Branch of a lumber mill this year. There is only one operator on the West Branch outside of the Great Northern and he sells to the paper company.

While the big paper companies are not talking much about their cut for their coming year, it is understood from reliable sources that it will be about the same as usual and that they will buy a great deal of pulpwood from independent operators in four-foot lengths. For several years the paper companies have been increasing their purchases of pulpwood, keeping their own cut about the same each year.

Even with the high wages paid, it is difficult to secure all the men needed and the employment agents say that men are more loath to stay in the woods all winter than ever before.

Construction jobs in the west offer wages unreamed of by common laborers in the east and this makes a heavy drain on the Maine woodmen supply. The condition is like that aptly expressed in the past that to run a woods camp in Maine, there must be three crews, one going into the woods, one coming out, and one at work.
