SUTHERLAND'S CORNERS.

A Post Office in the township of Euphemia, Lot 25, Con, 7, distant from Sarnia about 40 miles. Mails received daily. William Mounteer, postmaster.

CORUNNA.

A post village in the Township of Moore, and situated on the River St. Clair, about six miles below Sarnia. It was laid out by government in 1835. The village now contains one saw mill, three general stores, two blacksmith shops, one cabinet shop, five carpenter shops, two tailor shops, three shoe shops, one butcher shop, one brewery, four churches, and a common and separate school. The post-office was established in 1849; P. M. Stevens was the first postmaster. The present postmaster is H. J. Miller.

CHURCHES.

Christ Church, (Episcopal) built in 1861, cost \$2,000; number that can be seated, 300; Rev. David Armstrong, pastor.

St. Joseph's Church, (Roman Catholic) built in 1862; size, 50 × 70; cost \$6,000; Rev. Wm. Bobat, pastor.

Presbyterian Church, built in 185%; size, $24 \bowtie 36$; cost \$600; seats 150; no settled minister.

Wesleyan Methodist Church; size, 38 🖂 22; Rev. Mr. Smith, minister. built 1855

SCHOOLS.

Corunna common school, total attendance, 140; Benjamin Gott, teacher.

Corunna Roman Catholic separate school, total attendance, 30; average, 24; Harriet Viger, teacher.

GOOD TEMPLARS.

St. Clair Lodge, (organized 1860) meets every Tuesday in the Tem_ perance Hall. Post-office address, Corunna.
