# KING ASSURED CLEAR VOTING MARGIN OF 15 IN NEW HOUSE

## Liberals Make Extensive Gains In Dominion Vote

**Meighen Defeated in Portage La Prairie, While Conservative Strength Is Cut to Less Than 100 Seats**

### Majorities In Maritimes

TORONTO, Sept. 15 (8.25 a. m.)—After six weeks campaigning from coast to coast, culminating in yesterday's battle of the polls, political interest shifts back today to the capital to Parliament Hill, and perhaps to Rideau Hall itself. The most definite thing that emerges from the smoke of conflict is that Premier Meighen has failed in his bid for popular support, and has lost the solid foothold he had in the last parliament of leader of the largest group, with 116 supporters—just seven short of a clear majority. With all returns in, his following will be less than the round 100 Liberals returned in October of last year.

On the other hand, with seven seats still unreported, two of which may go into the Liberal column, Mr. Maclean, King, at early hour this morning, had already reached Mr. Meighen's following of 116 of that session. The Conservative, independent member for Labelle, who has not, during the last campaign, lost an opportunity of attacking Mr. Meighen's cause, comes on one side of the support of the three Labor members, A. A. Heaps, of Winnipeg North, and F. Woodsword, of Winnipeg North-Centre, who gave him pretty considerable support last session, as well as the new recruit to Labor ranks, H. B. Adcock, of Calgary East.

#### PROGRESSIVES GAIN.

In addition, there is the whole Progressive body, increased from a couple of dozen to about 20 members, lacking the cohesion with which it emerged from the 1921 election, but under Mr. King, showing more consistent support of the Liberal-Progressives, whose candidature was severely attacked by separate Progressive and Liberal members, and was successful yesterday to the number of eleven. They include in their number Mr. Poirier, remained last session as the Progressive leader, while affiliated with the party as a sole, is apt to be thrown in support of Mr. King. It is not a secret that a year ago Mr. Poirier was willing to enter a Liberal-Progressive coalition, himself, taking the portfolio of Agriculture.

#### MARGIN OF 15 SEEN.

Even therefore, if Mr. King cannot tally to-day any of the seven "straight" Progressives whom he won Miss Agnes Macphail gave him uniformly consistent support the 11 U. F. A. members, Mr. Albert and Mr. King, the Liberals, Labor, Independent and Liberal-Progressives, a voting strength of about 160, giving him the quite respectable margin of 15 on a division. Immediate interests centre on the course the course Mr. Meighen may elect to pursue.
