Sir Keith Smith Says Crude Oil Will be Used in

Rapid strides of invention has almost eliminated the dangers of flying, he said. Two big airships for the England-Australian and Australian-India service, now being built by Vickers would use crude oil instead of inflammable fuel thus removing the greatest danger to flying by airplane.

"The commercial feasibility of the airship has been thoroughly established" remarked Sir Keith. "The big ships which are now being built will have a capacity of 100 passengers as well as whatever baggage they need. This is to be a cold business proposition with a view not only to shorten the time between the countries but to give the utmost of comfort and service. "One of the existing airships will be first used in an experimental flight to make a study of conditions, such as changes of temperature to obtain general scientific data. Another large airship will be tested in England soon to determine just how great a load it will take and what the strain and stress will be on such a journey."


