Chicago, Sept. 14.—The German monopoly on rare chemicals has been broken, according to statements made today by Dr. H. T. Clarke, of Rochester, N. Y., before the Organic Division of the American Chemical Society, in session here. Before the war, hundreds of the chemicals essential to laboratory work were made exclusively in Germany, Dr. Clarke said, but now 800 of these rare chemicals are produced in America. ORGANIZED LABOR FRENCH BABIES FATE

Premier Meighen delivered an address at the annual convention of the trades and labor congress of Canada in Windsor, Ont., yesterday. He was introduced by President Tom Moore who told the delegates that if the premier should say things with which they were not in harmony it was their duty to give him an attentive hearing.

After reviewing the history of organized labor on this continent; the premier said that the best way to get results was to follow the same lines that had brought results in the past. He advocated exposing the facts and educating public opinion. He said that where the so-called theory of production for use had been put into practice in substitution for production for profit it has resulted in practically no production at all and has ended in chaos and starvation, and we must make and hold our place in a throng of competing countries, if we expect to maintain a good average of prosperity among our people.
