ENCOURAGING

Sussex Dairy Show Pronounced Success

Sussex, Dec. 4-The first annual dairy

show and convention of the New Brun-

swick Dairymen United closed here this

afternoon, after a series of successful

meetings. Hon. J. P. Tweeddale, minis-

ter of agriculture for the province, ad-

ressed the meeting and spoke of the im-

provements made in the output of the

dairies and cheese factories of New

Brunswick. He announced that con-

ference had been restored in the dairy

products of the province and predicted a

great future for this business.

The officers for the ensuing year were

selected as follows: president, A. E.

Trites, Salisbury; vice-president, F. G.

Hughson, Cornhill; auditor, F. H. Rose,

Cornhill; secretary-treasurer, H. W.

Coleman, Sussex; board of directors, F.

H. Rose, Cornhill, and W. W. Biggs,

Carletonville, representing cheese factory

patrons; J. L. Blackney, Wheaton's

Mills, and E. Trites, Salisbury, repre-

senting creamery patrons; J. H. Brown,

Cornhill, representing cheese makers; J.

P. Simmons, Moncton, representing but-

ter makers; Ben Keith, Havelock, pri-

vate cheese factory; F. G. Hughson,

Cornhill, joint stock cheese factories;

George Ransom, Woodstock, private

creamery; Arthur Soudet, St. Joseph's,

joint stock creamery.

Hon. Mr. Tweeddale remarked on the

increase in the dairy industry after

buttermilk and cheese produced in the

province. He said that butter produced in

1917 was 500,000 pounds, while in 1918

it was 900,000 pounds. The increase in

value was \$285,812. In 1917 there had

been produced 1,115,777 pounds of cheese

while in 1918 it had been increased by

\$208,248 pounds. The increase in value

was \$187,478.
