FIVE HOUSES AT

MILLIDGEVILLE BURN

A serious fire occurred last night at Millidgeville when five houses and a barn belonging to the Jewett estate were destroyed. Two families are homeless. The damage is estimated at from \$10,000 to \$12,000, with insurance of \$1,600 on three houses.

The fire was first seen in the house occupied by R. Logan and his wife. It jumped to the residence occupied by H. Codner, wife and family and it was only a short time until this residence was consumed. A call of help was sent in to the city. All, the houses and the barn belonged to the Jewett estate. In speaking to the Times this morning L. M. Jewett said that three of the houses when they were new would have been valued at \$3,500 each, but as they had deteriorated to a certain extent, he would now estimate the value of all five houses at from \$10,000 to \$12,000, with \$1,600 insurance. For the present the homeless families are being housed and cared for by their neighbors.
