Washington, May 16—Justice Stafford, of the District of Columbia supreme court today overruled the motion of organized baseball for a new trial of the suit of the Baltimore Federal League Baseball Club and awarded a judgment of \$240,000 in favor of the club with \$24,000 added for attorney's fees. An appeal was noted by counsel for organized baseball and a bond in the sum of \$350,000 furnished. The suit of the Baltimore Club was brought under the Sherman anti-trust laws and grew out of the disbanding of the Federal League.

FIVE HOUSES AT MILLIDGEVILLE BURN A serious fire occurred last night at Millidgeville when five houses and a barn belonging to the Jewett estate were destroyed. Two families are homeless. The damage is estimated at from \$10,000 to \$12,000, with insurance of \$1,600 on three houses. The fire was first seen in the house occupied by R. Logan and his wife. It jumped to the residence occupied by H. Codner, wife and family, and it was only a short time until this residence was consumed. A call of help was sent to the city. All the houses and the barn belonged to the Jewett estate. In speaking to the Times this morning L. M. Jewett said that three of the houses when they were new would have been valued at \$3,500 each, but as they had deteriorated to a certain extent, he would now estimate the value of all five houses at from \$10,000 to \$12,000, with \$1,600 insurance. For the present the homeless families are being housed and cared for by their neighbors.
