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GOOD WORDS FOR ST. JOHN PAVING

Praise From Engineers Who Have Inspected The Work Done Here

While White St. John has not as much permanent pavement as many other cities, what we have is equal to the best and better than most. This is the conclusion which the public works department of City Hall has arrived at as a result of the expressions of opinions by engineers from other cities, who have made a study of the work here.

Chief Engineer Campbell, who is in charge of the public highways of Ontario, succeeding "Good-Roads" Campbell, now deputy minister of railways, is in the city today and has been looking over the work which has been done here. He spoke very highly of the class of pavements laid in St. John and of the way in which the work has been done.

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When he noticed it he remarked that he was glad to find that another engineer had seen the same problem which he had to face when he was a city engineer, and that he had solved it in exactly the same manner which his own experience had proved was best and safest.

Another tribute to local pavements comes from Toronto. A St. John man who was in Toronto recently met the City engineer and in conversation with him asked for any advice he could give regarding pavement problems in St. John. The engineer replied that while passing through St. John last fall he took advantage of the opportunity to look over the paving work and after seeing what had been done he thought that Toronto could get advice from rather than give it to St. John. He approved of the specifications used which were similar to those in use in Toronto but said that better results were secured in St. John in the performance of the work, due, he thought, to more careful supervision and better supervision.

Several such tributes have come to the ears of the public works officials and they are naturally pleased that the methods they have used have met with such unbiased approval.

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
