

## TWO HOUSES IN MILFORD BURNED

The fire spread quickly to the house owned by Michael Kelly and occupied by Edward Eagles and his family. The houses burned until nothing but a pile of embers, about a foot above the ground, remained to show where they had been. The windows were all cracked in Mr. Marley's house by the heat from the blaze.

According to reports, Mr. Kerr is now the champion figure skater of the west. He commenced skating here when but seven years of age and is present with the tourist department of the C. P. R. The C. P. R. is arranging to have Oliver Kaidahl, a skater of international reputation, at Quebec this winter. He is of Swedish descent and is a champion in his line. His jumps have been among the longest on record. Another star who will be secured is Nels Nelson, of Revelstoke, B. C.

THE LATEST WAR MACHINE.

Modern warfare was demonstrated yesterday, when an armored

—A machine expected to revolutionize warfare, with a three-inch regulation field gun mounted forward, traveled at the rate of twenty-five miles an hour on Riverside Drive, negotiated the lower slope of the palisades on the other side of the Hudson, and then crossed the river under its own power.

The demonstration was attended by representatives of the War and Navy Departments, and by several hundred members of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers who are attending the forty-third annual meeting of the organization.

Rockenbach, commanding the tank corps, who was present for the War Department, said he considered the demonstration very successful. "It was a wonderful test," said General Rockenbach.
