titled to the following mention-d fees for the measur-
ment of vessels about to be registered for the first
time under the Act, or requiring measurement for
the purpose of registry, that is to say:

For Vessels under 100 tons register.....\$2
100 tons and not exceeding.....3
200 tons.....3
Over 200 tons and not ex-
ceeding 400 tons.....4
Over 400 tons and not ex-
ceeding 1,000 tons.....5
Over 1,000 tons.....6

His Excellency on the authority aforesaid has
further been pleased to Order, and it is hereby
ordered, that every Surveyor of Shipping shall
when required to travel for the purpose of mak-
ing any such measurement be entitled to demand
and receive from the persons requiring his ser-
vices such amount for travelling expenses as shall
have been actually, necessarily and bona fide ex-
pended by him for that purpose, such amount in
no case however to exceed the rate of fifteen cents
for every mile actually travelled by him.
