Science, and at the same time deliver to the Registrar of the Faculty the following certificate:—

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I, the undersigned, being desirous of obtaining the Degree of Doctor of Medicine and Master of Surgery, do hereby declare that I have attained the age of twenty-one years, (or, if the case be otherwise, that I shall have attained the age of twenty-one years before next graduation day).

10th.—The trial to be undergone by the candidate shall be :-

(1) A general written and oral examination on all the branches of

Medical and Surgical Science.

(2) A Clinical Examination in Medicine and Surgery conducted at the bedside, cases being submitted for diagnosis and treatment in the wards of the Hospital. In estimating the standing of candidates and the number of marks to be awarded, Professors shall take into account the regularity of their attendance, and the diligence and care they have evinced in reporting cases.

11th.—The examinations will be divided into Primary and Final, the former comprehending the branches of Anatomy, Chemistry, Materia Medica, Physiology, and Botany or Zooloogy; the latter those of Practice

of Medicine, Surgery, Obstetrics and Medical Jurisprudence.

12th.—Candidates shall present themselves for examination in the Primary Branches at the close of their second session, and in the Final Branches at the close of their fourth session or fourth year of study.

13th.—The fee for the Degree of Doctor of Medicine and Master of Surgery shall be twenty dollars, to be paid by the candidate before examination, together with a Registration Fee of one dollar.

## REGULATIONS FOR DEGREE IN PHARMACY.

Candidates for the Degree of Master in Pharmacy are required to present evidence of attendance upon two three months courses of Lectures npon Chemistry, Materia Medica and Pharmacy, and one three months course upon Botany and Microscopy, also of one year's practice in Dispensing Medicines. In lieu of above qualifications evidence of four year's experience in a Drug Store in the Dispensing of Medicines will be accepted.

The examinations to be passed for the Degree in Pharmacy shall be:

(1.) A Preliminary Examination to include English and Latin Languages—the first four rules of Arithmetic, Vulgar Fractions and Decimals.

(2.) A Written and Oral examination in Materia Medica, Chemistry, Botany and Pharmacy.

(3.) An examination in Practical Pharmacy and in Microscopy.

The fee for the Degree of Master in Pharmacy shall be ten dollars, to be paid by the candidate provious to the examination.
