The meteorological office have re-ports of two extraordinary occurrences yesterday. About 6.45 yesterday morn-ing, when the temperature was about 55, the barometer took a sudden drop and a tenth of an inch of rain fell within five minutes.

Ing, when the temperature was about 55, the barometer took a sudden drop and a tenth of an inch of rain fell within five minutes. During the greater part of the day the wind was from the southeast and south, and the fog, which drifted in, made it quite cool. At 4.40 p.m. the wind, after being moderate, suddenly shifted to the northwest and ran up to a grate of 66 miles an hour. Up to that time the wind had not exceeded 10 or 15 miles. In an hour the jump was made from this rate to 60 miles and hour, up to that time the wind had not exceeded 10 or 15 miles.
