August 6.

## FROM 20 TO 44 YEARS

British Subjects in United  
States Within These Ages  
Must Enlist or Be Drafted.

Boston, July 29.—In connection with  
the announcement from Washington  
that all British subjects between the  
ages of 20 and 44 must enlist in the  
British or Canadian armies by Septem-  
ber 28th or be drafted into the Amer-  
ican army, Major Kenneth D. Marriott,  
head of the British and Canadian re-  
cruiting mission in this state states  
that he had made arrangements for  
the examinations by the medical board  
for several hundred volunteers.

## SIX SAILORS DIE FROM

## A STRANGE ILLNESS

Entered St. Lawrence on  
Three Vessels — Disease  
Probably Spanish Influenza.

Quebec, July 29.—Six sailors from  
various ships died while on the St.  
Lawrence some time ago from a  
strange illness thought to be the fa-  
mous Spanish influenza. They came on  
three different vessels, one of which  
arrived with three dead sailors, an-  
other with two dead and a third with  
a sick man that died when nearing  
port. A number of other sailors were  
taken off at the quarantine station and  
are now doing well.

## The port authorities state that there

is no danger of the illness being car-  
ried into the country, since every pre-  
caution has been taken.

## LOCOMOTIVE ENTERS

## STATION AT LAURIER

Peculiar Freight Wreck on C.  
G. R.—Nobody Injured.

Quebec, July 29.—When two freight  
trains on the C. G. R., collided Sunday  
at midnight near Laurier station, the  
crew of one on-coming mogul jumped  
out of the cab. In another minute, fol-  
lowing the rear-end crash, their engine  
smashed its way through a number of  
cars and landed inside the little sta-  
tion damaging it seriously. Nobody  
was hurt.

not been raised in forty years.

## GERMAN IN DIGBY

suspected, escaped from the intern-  
ment camp at Amherst. The man  
was neatly dressed. The arrest was  
made by Sgt. Spurr and the local  
policeman. The prisoner is now in  
jail and will, no doubt, be sent back  
to Amherst.

## TRAIN HITS A BOY

Fredericton, July 29.—The incoming  
express train on the Fredericton  
branch of the C. P. R. this morning  
struck Jerry Myhrall, the young son  
of Joseph H. Myhrall, night porter  
at the Barker House, and injured him  
severely. The boy was taken to the  
Victoria Hospital.
