

and he would call the attention of the Supt General to the statement made in Mr Loring's letter in regard to the conduct of of a Constable, who is an Indian named Louis, employed by Capt Fitzgibbon, Stipendiary Magistrate. This man appears to have done his utmost to prevent the Indians from giving heed to the advice given them by the Indian Agent in respect to the abandonment by them of the Potlatch feast and the acceptance by them of the laws regulating Indian matters in the Dominion, and he appears to have been successful to a certain extent at least in so far as his own tribe were concerned, as ^{it} will be observed on reference to Mr Loring's letter that
