STRIKE IS THREATENING CARPENTERS AT FERNIE DEMAND

FERNIE, Aug. 7-The relief of homeless women, men and children of Fernie continues to be the principal work of the committee. Over 200 tents are erected in different parts of the city today and more are expected on Saturday. The greatest need is tents, but a full sup-

one Japanese was caught trying to break open a trunk today. Inside of 15 minutes he was sentenced to 60 days hard labor and he was immediately taken in charge by the officers who took him to Nelson. The sentence was greeted with cheers by the assembled crowd.

Great indignation is expressed by prospective builders at the carpenters who are demanding the eight hour day, with 50 cents an hour, time and a half for over time and double time for Sundays. They also demand that every man who works on buildings shall become a member of the union, the fee for which is \$25. The general laborers are holding

meetings every evening, discussing questions of importance to themselves.

Supplies of all kinds are pouring in from practically every part of Western Canada and many points in the United States. Weather continues warm with no prospect of rain. No new cases of smallpox have been discovered since the two from the lumber camp, which were isolated several days ago. The relief committee has moved from the coal company's office to the school grounds. Monetary assistance is accepted in preference to supplies. The total relief funds received to date amount to \$47,698.

The C.P.R. has erected a large tem-porary station here and other concerns are hastily erecting shacks. The mount-ed police are not now desired by citizens, the provincial police being fully able to cope with the situation. Miners are thought best to keep the women and children away until more buildings are

A carpenters' strike is liable to work a hardship in the city. The plan propos ed is to deport any man who refuses to work but the best method in the minds of many is to ask for two or three weeks truce, during which period the men must work at normal wages. By the end of that time, enough shacks will be erected to house the people requiring
