

3° One hundred dollars at least will be required to repair the Roads and nine small Bridges in the Reserve. Besides we shall have to hire two Gate-keepers at \$25 each during the summer.

4° We desire another School teacher appointed, who shall understand both English and Iroquois; as we think it necessary to have such a qualification to teach our children.

5° This winter hundreds of saw-logs have been drawn to the saw mill - some of them by persons who had no intention of building their houses with them, but only to dispose of them. These we desire to seize when we can get proof that they were so sold. A few had cut the wood on their farms, and sold it to the White people, and are now chopping fuel on other farms & selling to the Whites. Our ideas are to sell none, but keep it for the Tribe only.
