	March 18th 1945		C.A.V.U. Protestant and Roman Catholic Services held in the Chapel this morning and well attended. Hebrew service took place in the Station Library. "Can't Help Singing", starring Deanna Durbin, was shown to a large number of Station personnel.	
	March 19th 1945		Partly cloudy to overcast. Flying fit for 9:30 hours dual. First game of the finals in the Men's Basketball League was played tonight. Uplands Cagers defeated Rockcliffe, 47 - 43. The W.D.'s held their closing dance (by invitation only) in their Recreation Centre.	
	March 20th 1945		Overcast, mist, continuous rain. No flying. All airmen were cordially invited to attend the Farewell Smoker in the Airmen's Canteen, commencing at 2000 hours this evening. Uplands W.D.'s defeated Navy Wrens, 36 - 35, in the first game of the Semi-final series. The Inter-Service Athletic Council held a badminton tournament in the Drill Hall this evening, with Navy, Army and Air Force personnel participating. A.F.H.Q. were the winners.	
	March 21st 1945		Overcast to cloudy. Flying fit for 9:30 hours solo. Programme of fine classical music held in the W.D. Recreational Centre. Group Captain W.I. Clements, Commanding Officer, posted to R.C.A.F. Station, Gander, Newfoundland, handed over temporary command of the station to our former Chief Instructor, W/C A.D. Haylett.	
	March 22nd 1945		Overcast. No flying by No. 2 S.F.T.S. personnel. Twenty-ninth edition of the Uplands News was issued today, a copy of which is attached as Appendix "A". The Station Adjutant, F/L L.J. Ryan, proceeded on embarkation leave, prior to posting overseas.	
	March 23rd 1945		C.A.V.U. Flying fit for 9:30 hours dual. The final Station Dance for No. 2 S.F.T.S. personnel was held in the Drill Hall. A sixteen-piece orchestra from R.C.A.F. Station, Rockcliffe, was in attendance. All Station personnel & guests were invited. F/O Art Higginson acted as Master of Ceremonies for the floor show, made up of Station personnel. Trophies won during the Station Badminton Tournament were presented by the S.Ad.O., S/L W.G. Harrison, to Sgt Kaye Kennedy, Cpl "Cindy" Green, LAC Dubois, and LAC Cravit.
