Dear Sir:

I think it was in October, 1908, that I wrote a letter congratulating you on being selected by Sir Wilfrid Laurier as Minister of Labor in his Cabinet. If you will recall the incident, you will remember that I expressed the hope at that time that I would live to see you Prime Minister of Canada. I think that all that is necessary to realize the hope then expressed is, to use a horse-track phrase, for the people to "call out the horses."

To be serious, let me say that I must thank God that I have been spared to see you standing on the threshold of the Premiership and I have no hesttation in predicting that the moment an election is held in this country it will be Hon. W. L. McKenzie-King, Prime Minister of Canada and Leader of the Liberal party.
