A Premier Comes For Talks

The Canadian Prime Minister, Mr. MacKenzie King, arrives here to-morrow morning, ostensibly on a holiday. This is a popular expedient for avoiding too many official functions, for there are many points of importance to which the visitor and his advisers wish to devote their time to—points of considerable importance to Liverpool as a port of contact between the two countries. The work already done by Canada's Ministers of Finance and of Trade over here in sketching out suggested amendments to the Ottawa agreements will be discussed with Whitehall; the Dominion's financial credit will be debated; there will, doubtless, be talks on the curtailment of purchases of Welsh coal and on the prospects of a resumption of migration; and last, but not least, the Canadian Prime Minister will confer with the Coronation officials on the constitutional and ceremonial aspects of Imperial participation in the event.
