

"There comes a time in the affairs of men when they must prepare to defend not their homes alone, but the tenets of faiths and humanity on which their churches, their governments, and their very civilization are founded. The defence of religion, of democracy, and of good faith among nations is all the same fight. To save one, we must make up our minds to save all."

In seeking to bring home to your minds the future as I then saw it revealed, was I mistaken in the picture thus drawn? Was I right when I added:

"This, I believe, is the position in which all nations that cherish free institutions, individual liberty and social justice, find themselves today." Please note that I spoke, at that early date, not of our nation only, but of all freedom loving nations.

Was I right when, at the close of that broadcast, I said: "There is no home in Canada, no family, and no individual whose fortunes and freedom are not bound up in the present struggle." Was I mistaken in the vision of future possibilities, when I said: - "I appeal to my fellow-Canadians to unite in a national effort to save from destruction all that makes life itself worth living, and to preserve for future generations those liberties and institutions which others have bequeathed to us."?
