at the nearest hostelry and enjoy the country by rambling about on foot. If such excursions are supplemented by trips in canoe, rowboat, sail-boat, and motor-boat of ordinary speed, an intelligent view of the country, its people, and its great resources of natural beauty will then be possible—a view that would not be within the reach of those who limit the field of observation to what may be seen from the seat of a speeding automobile.
