AFTER leaving Lewiston the steamers head north-
ward, and follow the current for seven miles, the
beautiful shores of the United States on the
right and Canada upon the left, providing an
ever-changing panorama of delightful scenery. At the
mouth of the Niagara River a landing is made at the
summer resort of Niagara-on-the-Lake, one of the oldest
towns in Canada.

Directly opposite, on the United States shore, stands
Old Fort Niagara, one of the most interesting historical
spots in North America, bearing within its walls the relics
of two and a half centuries.

Upon leaving Niagara-on-the-Lake, the steamer imme-
diately enters Lake Ontario, upon her swift passage of
thirty miles across its beautiful waters. This sail affords
one of the most refreshing features of the trip to Toronto.
