July.—Buckwheat ploughed in and under the surface of soil has by long experience been proved a certain means of fertility. It is in many places better than clover, for it will grow where clover will not, that is on poor sandy soils. It has been recommended to plough and harrow the land fine and mellow, then saturate the buckwheat with stale chamber lye, or greasy pickle from the mackerel barrel, then dry with hickory ashes, a peck or half a bushel to every bushel of buckwheat. After the buckwheat is a few inches high, sow a bushel of gypsum to the acre toward evening. This will cause greater growth. In case the soil is very dry at seeding time, it is best not to sow the prepared seed in the morning, but toward evening; let it lie all night, then harrow it and roll it early in the morning while the soil is wet with dew.
