PROGRESS OF THE ORDER

BENEFITS GIVEN BY THE I.O.F.

YOUR special attention is called to this first class Fraternal Benefit Society, and you are invited to become a member thereof, thereby securing the substantial benefits set forth under Sections "(A)" and "(B)" following, in addition to the social and fraternal privileges of its Court or Lodge rooms, which are to be found throughout the Dominion of Canada, the northern and healthy sections of the United States, Great Britain and Ireland, and Norway.

(A) For Yourself, During Your Lifetime.

Free Medical Attendance of the Court Physician within whose jurisdiction you may be taken ill, except where the Court has by hyday dispensed with free medical attendance. Some Courts, in addition, furnish medicine free, and in cer-tain cases transfer Jures.

2. A Sick Benefit of 83.00 per week for the first two weeks, and 85.00 a week for the next two weeks, and as provided in the Constitution and Laws of the Orler \$310 a week for an additional Warkow weeks. The Sick and Funceral Benefits are optional. It costs 82.00 extra to become enrolled for these benefits; the monthly perminime run from 40 cents 08.100 per month, according to ag at enrolment,

3. A Total and Permanent Disability Benefit of \$2.6, \$500, \$1,000, \$1,500 \$2,000 or \$2,500 for toxistate the face value of your Mortuary Benefit Certificate or Policy with evenption from further payments of assessments or premiums and Court dues, upon becoming totally and permanently disabled by disease or acci-dent, which may occur at any time.

4. An Old Age Benefit consisting of exemption from payment of assessments r premiums and Court dues after reaching the age of savestry years.

5. An Old Ac Disability Benefit which is available only after reaching the age of REVENT years.
5. An Old Ace Disability Benefit which is available only after reaching the age of REVENT, and consists of \$60, \$100, \$250, \$400 or \$500 (or 0xx-reserved frace value of your Mortuary Benefit Certificate or Policy), payable yearly for rest years from the date, at which you are adjudged to be totally and permanently disable by the infimities of age. If death should occur before the rest amusil payments have been made, the usual instalments would be paid in one sum to your beneficiaries.

6. An Old Age Pension Benefit payable annually during the period of your disability, which you can elect to take instead of the Old Age Disability Renefit yoon being adjudged totally and permanently disabled by the infimities of age. The amount of the Old Age Pension Benefit depends on the amount of the certificate or policy at age of 70, the amount of pension would be \$546; at age 75, it would be \$549; etc.

(B) For Your Beneficiaries, at Your Death.

A Burial Benefit of \$100 (if you have elected to take the Old Age Pension enefit) to insure decent burial.

8. A Funeral Bz.nefit of 850 (if at the time of your death you are enrolled in the Sick and Funeral Benefit Department) to assist in defraying funeral expenses.

9. A Mortuary Benefit of \$500, \$1,000, \$2,000, \$3,000, \$4,000 or \$5,000, or so much thereof as has not been previously paid to yourself.
