A motion was made and feconded, that it be "Refolved, that Motion for a refolved it is the opinion of this Houle, that the fervices of the Members of this House are of equal benefit to the different counties, and should the Member's receive pay from any particular county, it might be an inducement to attend more to the interest of such county than to that of the province at large, and they might thereby be less difinterested; and also, if that mode was adopted, it would, in the opinion of this House, tend to destroy an equal representation, as Candidates in town, or where Affemblies may be holden, might attend without equal expence to Candidates in the diftant counties, and thereby be enabled to offer themfelves as Candidates without pay, which might operate to the difadvantage of the electors in fuch counties, as by fuch offer, an elector might be induced, in order to avoid expence, to give his vote different from what otherways he would have done, and this House be principally composed of non-relidents who. might be incompetent representatives of the distant parts of this province."
