

### To Motor Boat Owners SPECIAL NOTICE!

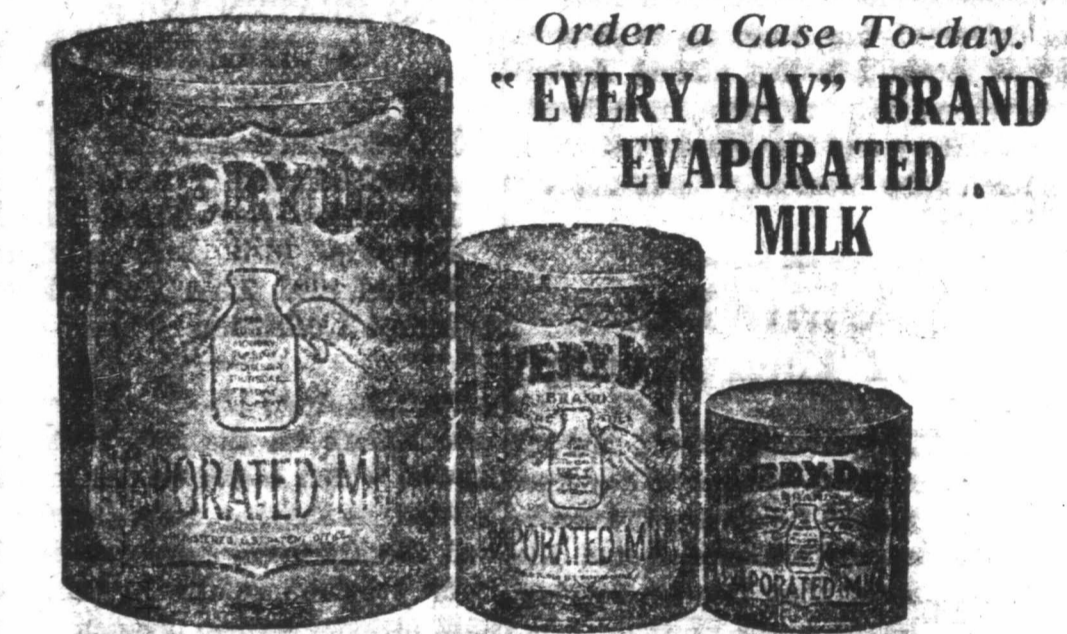
