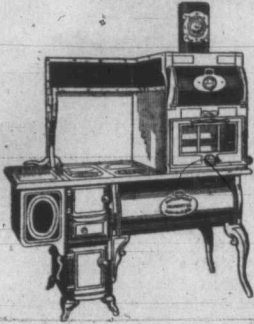

## OBITUARY

William Murphy

The death of William Murphy an aged and highly respected citizen took place at his residence Northville on Thursday, Sept 7th aged 80 years. The funeral service was held on the following Saturday and was largely attended burial at Kentville, St. Joseph's burying grounds.

Mr. Murphy was unmarried and had resided all his life at Northville as well as his father before him. He leaves four sisters, Mrs. Moran, of Boston; Mrs. James Quigley of South Alton and Misses Anastasia and Elizabeth Murphy at home in Northville.

Everett M. Rottler.

It is with deep sympathy we record the death of one of the popular young men of Kentville in the person of Everett M. Rottler, which occurred last Thursday morning at the Victoria General Hospital, Halifax. Death followed an automobile accident which took place in Kentville, twenty-three days previously in Hiltz's Garage, where the deceased young man was fixing a bolt on an automobile, his car being struck by another car. Realizing the seriousness of the injuries sustained, Mr. Rottler was taken to Halifax on a special train, where he was operated on at the hospital. The operation was successful, but complications set in resulting in death.

The remains were brought to Kentville on Thursday evening, and the funeral services were conducted on Sunday from his late home. Rev. T. C. Mellor officiated and the interment was in the Oakes Cemetery. Many friends assembled at the service and numerous floral tributes were received, all of which testified to the high esteem in which the departed young man was held by the community. Among the flowers received were beautiful pieces from the family, the Peerless Garage, Town Boys, Kentville Chauffeurs, and many friends both in Kentville and suburbs.

The deceased was twenty-two years of age, and had always resided in Kentville.

He is survived by his parents, Mr and Mrs A Rottler, 2 brothers, Arthur, residing in Waverley, Mass., and Roy, at home, and one sister, Miss Gladys at home, to all these is extended much sympathy in their sad bereavement.

James Everett Eaton

In the death of James Everett Eaton, which took place at his home on Main Street Wednesday morning, of heart disease, following an active life, the citizens of Collingsville feel that they have lost one of the best of their number. Born in Nova Scotia 68 years ago, Mr. Eaton came to Collingsville 28 yrs. ago and all of that time has been employed by the Collins Company. He was quiet and minded his own business to rare degree. While this was true all felt that they were dealing with a man of rare intelligence and who was very kind hearted. He is survived by his wife, who was Miss Sophia Bentley, and seven children, ten grandchildren, three brothers and two sisters.

The children are L. E. Eaton of Derry, New Hampshire; Mrs. W. A. Stewart, of New York; Mrs. William Schott, of Irving, N.J.; A. Harold Eaton of Collingsville; Mrs. Herbert Clark, of Newark, N.J.; Mrs. Leighton Lawson, of Unionville and Lieutenant Philip Eaton, who is on the United States Revenue Cutter, in Alaskan water. The brothers are A. W. Eaton, of Pittsfield, Mass.; D. O. Eaton, of Philadelphia; and W. E. Eaton, of Sheffield Mills; and the sisters are Mrs. T. W. Offen, of Wolfville, Nova Scotia, and Mrs. F. W. Thomas, of Upper Canard, Nova Scotia.

The funeral was very largely attended at his late home in this

village Friday afternoon at 2.30 and the service was conducted by Rev. G. F. Bailey. The bearers were W. U. Chapin, Walter Reid, M. Stanley Neal, Frank W. Fellows, Frank Borden and Jerry Hosford; all holding responsible positions in the Collins Company works. Mr. Eaton was a member of the Baptist church and was also a member of a Royal Arcanum lodge in Hartford.—Farmington Valley Herald, Collingsville, Conn.
