COLONIAL AFFAIRS.

Chamberlain Discusses the Reid Contract in Plain Terms. The Federal Obsequies of the Late Lord Metchley Tonight—Urgent Treatment of the Finnish Deputation—Aguinaldo's Perseverance—Cable News.

London, March 21.—The course of the discussion of the Reid contract in the House of Commons yesterday, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, Mr. Joseph Chamberlain, replied to various colonial questions raised.

With regard to the Reid contract with Newfoundland, he said that he had delayed in making a decision because of the tremendous interference upon the part of the Imperial Government with a self-governing colony, and either course would have brought the colony into bankruptcy, for which he would have held responsible.

Concluding, Mr. Chamberlain remarked that although he shared largely in the opinion in regard to the Reid contract, he might be mistaken, and the Government of the colony might be right.

Speaking of the West Indies, Mr. Chamberlain said that he thought it was impossible to give those islands representative government, and he had made the painful admission that he was incapable of efficiently carrying out large operations which were handed over to the contractor, whom he believed to be competent and honorable.

Touching the Transvaal question, Mr. Chamberlain said that not one of the President's proposals was really agreeable to the Transvaal, and he would remove nine out of ten of the conditions.

Mr. Chamberlain concluded with saying that he would not give the conditions which he considered a fair basis for a settlement, and he would continue to watch the situation most carefully, but that there was nothing to justify an ultimatum, and, failing compliance, war, which seems to have been suggested by a previous speaker.

AGUINALDO IS FURIOUS. Que. Legarda Decapitated for Suggesting Peace Overtures. Manila, March 21.—It is reported on good authority that Aguinaldo is taking extreme measures to suppress signs calculated to cause a cessation of hostilities.

On Friday last General Legarda visited Manila for the purpose of advising Aguinaldo to quit. He argued with the insurgent leader and attempted to induce him to lay down his arms, but he was rebuffed.

General Legarda was rebuffed and returned to Manila. He was furious at the advice and ordered General Legarda to be executed immediately.

LOBBYING IN ENGLAND. Ceremonies on Landing Them in England—New at His Late Home. Portsmouth, Eng., March 21.—The British minister to the Vatican and the Count of St. James is accompanied by the staff of the Pope as he visits Queen Victoria.

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THE LEGISLATURE.
