Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, except ing 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of

extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres more or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant a Dominion Lands Agency or Subagency for the district in which the land is situated. Entry by (TJX)
