

We, in South Esk are satisfied to have the line traced and established, if not already done according to the definitions of the act, which I quoted in the beginning, and if Derby Parish will agree to the same, it might be possible to arrange to have a delegation from the two Parishes confer with the Governor-in Council to have the matter fairly ad justly settled once and for all.
