The Work of the Session.

On Friday afternoon last His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor came down to the Council Chamber and presented the Legislature with the following speech:

Mr. President and Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council. My Speech and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly.

The diligent attention which you have bestowed upon the business brought under your consideration, enables me, after an unusually short session, to relieve you from further anxiety upon your legislative duties, and I desire to express to you my acknowledgments for the various measures which you have passed in the interests of the Province.

I feel confident that you will join me in deploring the unfortunate outbreak which has occurred in the North West Territories, and that you will join me in the hearty prayer that peace and good order may be speedily restored, so that the progress of the Province may be unimpeded.

The joint address which you have adopted to Her Majesty the Queen, praying Her Majesty to exercise her prerogative in the most liberal manner, as well as for compensation for loss sustained by reason of past impediments to the session, shall do you credit, and I sincerely trust that your efforts will result in the speedy restoration of the Province to its normal state.

In now taking leave of you, I earnestly pray that during the recess a kind Providence may direct and bless your individual labors, and that you may, when you represent, so that happiness and prosperity may abound in our Island.

The volume of business which under our altered circumstances, since Confederation, there is to be disposed of by our Local representatives, is as large as that of any other province, and, consequently, the number of persons who annually meet together to transact it, is disproportionately large.
