Never the peaceful sleep! Lost, ah me! each wondrous charm That held me captive! Lo! With Youthtime gone, no longer beats My heart as long ago!


Life's first impressions now I know Are drawn in colors rare. Brief is their stay, they come no more In years that live with care!
