## Abraham Lincoln.

Author of "At Good Old Siwash." Abraham Lincoln, America's tallest, omeliest and greatest statesman, was orn in Kentucky 107 years ago tolay. He was an Illinois man, but owing to the remarkably poor facili ties for getting born in Illinois in 1809. e was compelled to choose Kentucky for a native state. Later on, he lingered in Indiana long enough to acquir his first pair of pants and came to llinois a few years later, when na-

He was a great philoso er, and understood the political stions of the day, so thoroughly hat he was able to illustrate them by nny stories which would make him age money on the vaudeville stage than he ever made out of polics. In his youth, he was a champior ail-splitter, and this skill afterwards nabled him to split the Democratic arty with such success that he be ne President in 1861.

Linco' had always been opposed to

slavery, and made a practice of alludng to this fact even in sections where politionism was more unhealthy than alaria. When he was elected, the outh seceded, and four years Lincoln loted his country through the greatst civil war of history. There were annons in front of him, "copper neads" behind him, and advisers on all sides of him, but he bore up against all these perils with such firmness and bravery, and kindness and patriotism, and tact, and common sense, and humor that the world took off its hat to him and has never put it back. When he was assassinated in 1865, he was so well beloved that men called him beautiful when they looked at

Some men require fifteen years of chooling to become wise. Lincoln's visdom was home-made and the pattern has never been duplicated. He showed the world how to become an orator in 200 words, which is still 900 below the average record: more wise in short stories and jokes, as in fourteen-syllabled words. ike a great mountain peak, he looms higher as he recedes from us and to day Republicans and Democrats alike uarrel over the possession of his
