NEW DEPARTURE IN SEAL KILLING - FEBRUARY PELTS BETTER THAN THOSE "SCULP-ED" IN MARCH-TRURO KILL. ERS HAVE SOMETHING YET TO

TRURO, Dec. 15.-Capt. Laurie E. D. Stevens, the aviator, who is to head the expedition to Newfoundland to "spot" seals by airplanes, expects to leave here about the middle of next month. He will be accompanied by Flight Lieutenant L. Logan Barnhill and Air Mechanician Atkir

Captain Stevens states that the flying equipment has reached Newfoundland and that the hangars, sheds, etc., are now being put up. The point chosen as headquarters is Grand Falls, Nfld. Three Airco machines and three dirigibles have arrived there. The airplanes are in charge of Captain Cotton, the well known British aviator who last year attempted to fly from London to Cairo, but was forced to land in Italy. The dirigibles are in charge of Lieutenant Tippen, an English aviator. The value of the airplanes, dirigibles and equipment, said Capt Stevens, is more than half a million


