### From Peasant to Royal Consort.

When Alexis Razoum opened his eyes under the humble roof of his peasant father, he would have been a daring prophet who would have foretold that he would one day blossom into a Count, Field Marshal, and Viceroy, the greatest man in one of the Empires of Europe, with an Empress of all the Russians for his wife.

It was a sordid novel in the village of Lemesh where the child drew his first breath on April 23, 1879. His father was a drunken shepherd, of a violent temper, and a terror to the neighbourhood. The village priest took young Alexis in hand, little dreaming that he was paying the way which was to lead the shepherd's lad to the dizzy heights in Russia. Alexis had a voice of almost superhuman sweetness, and people flocked from far and near to listen to him. He was brought under the notice of a great Court Official at Moscow, to enchant the Princess Elizabeth who weary of the pomps, vanities, and wickedness of a depraved court, took him to her heart, and in a few years gave him charge of her purse and properties; before he reached manhood Alexis found himself chief favourite and "minister" to the daughter of an Emperor. A few years of splendour and luxury passed for the peasant's son, until at last Elizabeth succeeded to the throne of Russia and Alexis was raised to dizzy heights. He blossomed into General, Grand Master of the Hounds, Chief Gentleman of the Bedchamber, and Lord of large estates. He was given for bride a grand-niece of Elizabeth, and at twenty-two he was Viceroy of the Ukraine, virtual sovereign of a kingdom of his own.

But Alexis cared little for power, rank and riches. "Poney," he said, "is peasant's son bring a count; and a man who ought to be tending sheep, a Field-Marshal." However, partly due to fate, and partly due to the machinations of Elizabeth's ministers, he one day found himself standing side by side with Elizabeth before the Village Altar of Porevo, and the words were spoken which made the shepherd's son husband of the Empress. Two children were born to them, a son and a daughter, the latter, after a life of strange romance, ending her days in a loathsome dungeon of the fortress of Saint Peter and Paul, the victim of Catherine II's vengeance. On Elizabeth's death, Alexis was glad to turn his back on the splendours and shallowness of the court. He asked nothing better than to be allowed to spend the rest of his days in retirement and obscurity, and with this object in view he made his home in the most modest of the country houses Elizabeth had lavished upon him.

### Ancient Japanese Game.

#### PRINCE WILL WITNESS SPECIAL EXHIBITION.

TOKIO, (Associated Press)—Lovers of almost any popular sport enjoyed in the Occident would find an appeal in Japanese polo or "dakyu," as it is called here, for the game seems to be a combination of golf, lacrosse, billiards, bowling, horsemanship and even football, as it entails considerable risk to the players. A special exhibition of this game will be played in honor of the Prince of Wales during his visit here, and as the future British ruler is a lover of all sports, particularly horsemanship, he is expected to display keen interest in the contest. How the game originated is not known, but it has been played since ancient times, and still is reserved largely for young noblemen and officers of the military staff, who are practically the only ones able to acquire an equestrian standard high enough to make the sport exciting. The contest is held on a regular course 60 by 20 yards, boarded up at one end by a high fence. In the middle of the field is a small pocket into which the balls have to be thrown. On either side of this pocket are movable discs, which mark the score by being moved up and down. The last two discs are marked by a cross, and it is not until one of these has disappeared that the game is decided.

#### HOW IT IS PLAYED.

A number of red and white balls, one of each crossed to correspond with the discs, are thrown in before the game begins. Then the players, eight in red and eight in white, all dressed in old style native costumes, with saddles, and accoutrements to match, ride in alternately in stately procession, salute the distinguished guests and begin the game. Each player carries a short bamboo wand with a small net attached to the end, and his object is to stoop and capture the ball in this net corresponding to the color of his team. He then rides furiously towards the goal, where he attempts to pitch the ball into the cup from the net. During the throwing of the first three or four balls there is no serious opposition on either side, but when they have been thinned out somewhat and one side finds itself losing ground, the battle becomes fast and furious. The losing side begins riding and dashing at its opponents from all sides, cutting in front, circling from behind and balking them in every way possible. The crisis is reached when nothing remains but the last two crossed balls, by which the game is decided. Here the horsemanship and skill of the players is developed to the fullest and it is described as no mean feat to secure and carry a ball in a little net through a crowd of skilled players, yelling, galloping and interfering with all their energy. Even when the ball is safely in the net and the goal is reached, the last shot has to be made with eight men dashing forward, straining every muscle to prevent it going into the cup. When one side has scored, the game is called and the players ride from the field, saluting the dignitaries as before.
