

Nassagaweya Council.
The Council met pursuant to adjournment on Monday the 24th day of Feb. Members all present, the Revue in the chair. The minutes of last meeting were read and confirmed. Mr. Easterbrook moved, seconded by Mr. Elliott, that the report of the Tavern Inspector be received, read and endorsed on the minutes. Carried. Report read, and the applicants for licenses being present, received their certificates, viz: Alex. Davidson, Farmers Arms; William Easterbrook, Campbellville Inn; Michael Lyon, Halton Hotel; Martin Hunter, Ontario Hotel, and Lewis Schram, Townline Inn. Mr. Elliott moved, seconded by Mr. Easterbrook, that the statistical report of the public schools in the Township of Nassagaweya for the year 1872, by the County Inspector, be received and read, and ordered to be printed with the financial statement. Carried. Mr. Easterbrook moved, seconded by Mr. Kean, that having received a communication from William Job, resigning the office of Pound-keeper, through ill health, resolved, that Peter Chisholm be appointed in place of the said William Job, resigned. Carried. Mr. Easterbrook moved, seconded by Mr. Gillies, that having heard certain statements from S. Smith, Esq., in regard to the assessment of lot 17, and the east half of lot 16 in the 7th Con., for the year 1872, resolved that the matter lay over until the next meeting of Council, and that the Clerk notify the Assessor to attend said meeting. Carried. Mr. Elliott moved, seconded by Mr. Easterbrook, that the sum of \$2.84 be paid to David Hutcheon, for one sheep killed by dogs, and the further sum of \$5.34 to George Irving for two sheep worried, being two thirds value for said claims. Carried. Mr. Easterbrook moved, seconded by Mr. Elliott, that Arch. McNeill be appointed Overseer in road division No. 34, in place of Joseph McGlaughlin, resigned. Carried. Mr. Elliott moved, seconded by Mr. Easterbrook, that James Hunter, James McMillan, and William Harris, perform their share of labour on the base line, between the Township of Nassagaweya and Nelson, opposite lots No. 1, in the 2nd and 3rd Con., and John Henderson on the base line opposite the west half of the 4th con., the said labour to be performed under the supervision of James Hunter. Carried. Mr. Elliott moved, seconded by Mr. Easterbrook, that the petition of George Norrish, Daniel McCurdy, Lambert Barrethe, Thomas Taylor, Jeremiah Fletcher and John Fletcher, praying for aid in behalf of Patrick McGarrigal, a poor and indigent person, be received and read. Carried. Mr. Easterbrook moved, seconded by Mr. Gillies, that having heard the petition of George Norrish and five others in behalf of Patrick McGarrigal, resolved that this Council take no action in the matter, being credibly informed that said party has property sufficient to supply his present wants. Carried. Mr. Easterbrook moved, seconded by Mr. Gillies, that S. R. Lister be appointed to collect all arrears of taxes, for 1872. Carried. On motion the Council adjourned to meet at the call of the Revue.


