GERMAN AUTHORITY SAYS UNITED STATES IS WRONG ABOUT PANAMA CANAL

In Violating Hay-Pauncefote Treaty, Although Free to Penalize Railway Owned and Subsidized Vessels

BERLIN, Sept. 8.—The privileges accorded by the Panama Canal Act to American vessels engaged in the coasting trade is a violation of the Hay-Pauncefote treaty, according to Wilhelm Kaufmann, the well-known professor of international law at Bonn University. In an article published in today's Tagblatt, in which the professor deals, point by point, with the controversy, he says that in many respects the United States is entitled to impose conditions of entire equality provided for by the treaty. The exclusion of railroad-owned shipping is, he says, justified because those vessels are practically subsidized.

OTTAWA, Sept. 8.—Premier Borden was expected to arrive in the capital on his return from England at noon today and quite a number of friends went to the Central station to greet him. They were surprised to learn, however, that the premier came to the capital on the Soo train which reached the city about 1 a.m. Mr. Borden, who was somewhat fatigued, drove direct to his residence, where he remained all day. On Monday he will again spend a strenuous day. At noon he will be escorted from his residence to the city hall, where a civic address will be read. Later on in the afternoon he will formally open the Dominion exposition at the Central fair grounds. In the evening the premier will make his first set speech since his return to Canada at a banquet to be tendered him at the Chateau Laurier.

PREMIER BORDEN'S CORONATION ENTHUSIASM RECEIVED ON HIS RETURN TO CANADA

MONTREAL, Sept. 8.—Few more enthusiastic welcomes have been accorded to any Canadian prime minister abroad and for the manner in which he represented Canada. At the reception here he held since his return the partisan element has been eliminated. The series of spontaneous tributes to the premier as a leader and a man. Ottawa, Sept. 8.—J. A. M. Aikens, M. P. for Brandon, arrived here today from a trip to Britain and the continent. Asked regarding the interview purposes to have been given by him, in which he was quoted as saying that England and Germany were now in an actual state of war, Mr. Aikens says that he was both misunderstood and misquoted. "Who is wished to convey was that the two nations are playing a war game. Both have drawn cards, and it is now a matter of the one or the other to cash in. I think it is a fair bet that Germany can take a hand and show Germany that the empire holds an overwhelming hand. Then, he believes, the German would leave the table and quit the game."
