THE WEATHER PROPHECY.
Toronto, Feb. 16-17 p.m.—The depression which was over Lake Superior last night has moved to the Gulf of St. Lawrence, and another which formed over the Southwest States is moving eastward over Illinois and is causing rain in the lake region. The pressure has decreased a little over the Northwest Territories, but the weather continues cold. Minimum and maximum temperatures: Calgary, 11° below—12° below; Edmonton, 10° below—11° below; Qu'Appelle, 25° below—26° below; Winnipeg, 20° below—21° below; Toronto, 25°—45°; Montreal, 24°—45°; Quebec, 25°—45°; Halifax, 10°—12°.

Did They Steal the Horse?
