Fire Hazard.

Prof. Charles B. Gibson, of Chicago, in his special report to the insurance companies on the "Hazard of Steam Pipes," and upon "Coverings for Steam Pipes," says: "All organic matter, such as hair felt, becomes more or less charred by constant contact with hot steam pipes, even though the temperature be but a little above the boiling point of water; and by steam of 300° F, and above, so thoroughly seorched after a time as to become very fragile and to crumble away rapidly. It is noticeable that the dust formed from this charred material is very combustible and will flash like gunpowder when thrown into the fire. When steam of high temperature is used it is by far the safest to employ a covering wholly incombustible. Mineral Wool is the most satisfactory covering and is absolutely fire-proof.
