city for some days, and have prepared complete plans of an underground system such as this city requires.

A series of blue prints in book form were submitted, explaining the sort of work required, with explanations.

Mr. Stannard, in addressing the committee, which was practically the council, eight aldermen and the mayor being present, declared that while the initial cost was much greater, eventually the city would save money. He pointed out that one-half of 1 per cent per annum was all that was required for maintenance, while an aerial system required 7½ per cent per annum, from depreciation, and 5 per cent for maintenance, a total of 12½ per cent—a considerable sum.

He also suggested that the Legislature be petitioned to give the city of London the power to compel the London Electric, the Bell Telephone and the telegraph companies doing business in the city, to place their wires underground.

It was the intention to open tenders for underground work, but only one tender was received, that of the G. N. Guest Company, the others asking for further time. This was granted, and tenders will be opened on Nov. 22.

Prices for 5 to 20 ducts will be submitted.

KNIGHTS OF LABOR DENOUNCE FEDERATION

Criticize Stand Taken By Gompers, Mitchell and Morrison Over Injunction.

Washington, Nov. 11.—A vitriolic denunciation of President Gompers, Secretary Morrison and Vice-President John Mitchell, the three American Federation of Labor officers, who are concerned in the famous "conspiracy case," contained in the annual report of General Master Workman Simon Burns, head of the Order of Knights of Labor, now in session here.

"Where is there a more willful, premeditated violence of law than in this case?" queries Burns. "The action of the so-called leaders will be harmful for years to come whenever an attempt is made to secure legislation for the benefit of the worker. There is no trust or combination of capital in the world that violates any more laws or offends than the trust labor organizations, who resort to more dishonest, unfair and dishonorable methods towards their competitors than any trust or combination in the country."

Burns takes pains to indicate that his censure is aimed particularly at the three federation leaders, and only generally at the organization as a whole.

"It looks as if Gompers, Mitchell and Morrison," he explains, "desire to do something sensational so as to keep themselves prominently before the public."

Contrasting Burns argues that if Van Cleave, or the Truck Store and Range Company, the real prosecutors of the conspiracy against Gompers, Morrison and Mitchell, had violated the terms of an injunction similar to that issued against the labor leaders, there would be a tremendous "choc" from the federation officials.

"It is public slander," Burns states, "to say justice has not been meted out to organized labor and every citizen exactly alike. I think the sentence of the court severe, but we are given to understand some of these defendants said they would never pay a fine nor permit labor to pay it for them. It will be a most
