term last evening at the school.

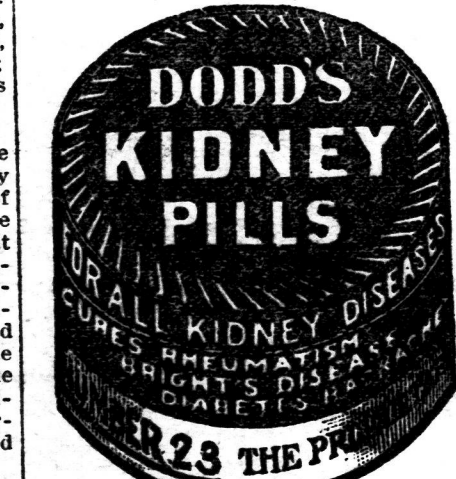
There was a large attendance, and

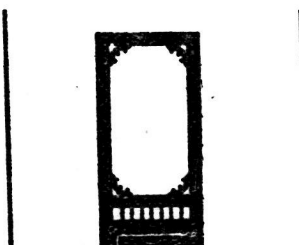

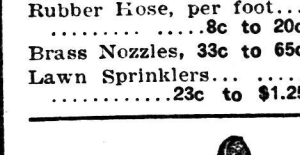

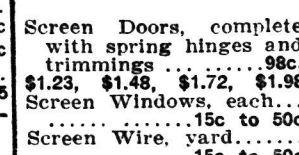
