

EMISSARIES FROM MANITOBA TAKEN BY ALBERTA POLICE

Four Placed Under Arrest Charged With Violation of the Elections Act—Famous "Workers" Invade Alberta to Fight the Liberals.

Edmonton, April 14.—Two hundred and fifty emissaries, who were specially appointed by the Government of Alberta last week to preserve the respectability of the present election campaign, are beginning to show results. Reports of the arrival of four of the Hon. Robert Rogers' political emissaries from Manitoba were received at the office of the provincial Liberal organizer here today. A man who calls himself Crutcher, but who is really said to be a famous worker who figured prominently in the MacDonald by-election last fall, was taken into custody at Carmanagay on suspicion. He was tried and remanded for eight days. The charge against him is that of bribery under the election act, and also that of supplying liquor to an elector.

Main Estimates for Province

Toronto, April 14.—Old Man Ontario's preliminary bill of expenses for 1913-14 is \$9,524,537.66, comprising the main estimates for the fiscal year commencing Nov. 1 next, which were presented to the Legislature yesterday. The main estimates for last year were \$8,444,966.66, and the increase is largely accounted for in salary increases and higher maintenance charges on public institutions, as well as a natural growth in the provincial services. The amount is divided as follows: Current expenditure for 1913-14, \$8,553,387; capital expenditure, \$1,042,000; other purposes, \$129,000. The distribution under the various headings is as follows: Civil Government, \$778,024; legislation, \$299,355; administration of justice, \$771,259.96; education, \$2,139,841; public institutions maintenance, \$1,462,612; agriculture, \$731,936; colonization and immigration, \$122,600; hospitals and charities, \$810,000; colonization and departmental buildings, \$172,020; public buildings—(1) repairs, \$82,700; (2) capital account, \$958,800; public works, \$83,200; colonization and mining roads, \$129,000; charges on crown lands, \$679,500; refunds account, \$92,500; miscellaneous expenditure, \$609,345.

SETTLED IN MISSOURI SEVENTY YEARS AGO

Funeral of Donald Patience Was Held to Ingersoll Rural Cemetery.

FATAT STRIKE RIOTS

One Man Killed in Clash Between Railway Laborers and Police.

New York, April 14.—One man was shot and killed, one was mortally wounded, and several others injured in a battle at Mamaroneck today between the police and several hundred strikers who were on strike against the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad. Five strikers are under arrest charged with rioting in the county jail at White Plains. The sheriff of West Chester County has gone to Mamaroneck with a force of deputies in anticipation of further rioting.

INTERNAL STRIFE IN TORONTO HYDRO OFFICE

General Manager Says Inside Politics Is Injuring Department and Wants New Chairman.

Toronto, April 15.—Internal conditions in the Toronto hydro-electric commission have been brought to a head by a letter signed by W. R. Sweeney and his associates on the staff, sent to the mayor and the board of control, in which they alleged "inside politics," charge the deterioration of the institution, and ask the immediate appointment of a successor to P. W. Ellis, the chairman, whose term has just expired. It has been noted about the city hall for several days that there was dissatisfaction in the ranks, and a request made to Mayor Hocken yesterday afternoon brought forth the letter which had been sent to him and the members of the board of control.

TO HOLD INQUIRY.

It is said that since Mr. Geary left the commission, and Mr. Drayton became a member of the Dominion railway board, and resigned from the hydro, there has been more or less strife in the organization. Mayor Hocken is a member of the commission, but is naturally engaged a large part of his time in his duties as the city's chief executive, and the management has been left in the hands of Mr. Ellis.

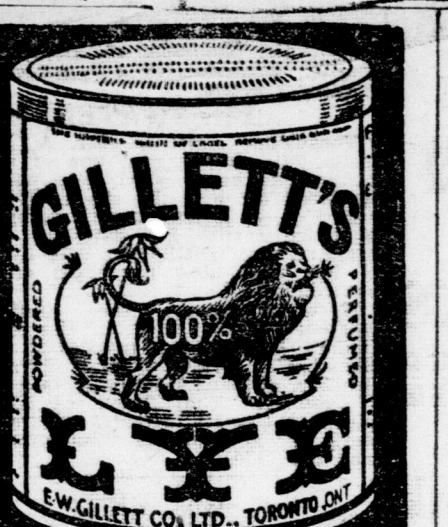
