MABEE'S DEATH MEANS GREAT LOSS TO CANADA

Many Eulogies Pronounced On
Late Chairman of the
Railway Commission.

Toronto, May 7.—Many eulogies were pronounced on the late Hon. J. P. Mabey today. In the court of appeal Mr. Justice Garrow in the absence of Sir Charles Moss, said:

"In the higher position as chairman of the railway commission he displayed qualities that will render it difficult to replace him with any one in sight, though I do not despair of the country's securing a fitting successor. So far as that office was concerned, he was a particularly strong man, and the right man in the right place."

James Bicknell K. C., "Everybody admits that he was a big man, and that the country sustains a heavy loss in his death."

Chief Justice Mulock: "The country has sustained a great loss in the untimely death of Mr. Justice Mabey. After displaying remarkable judicial ability, he was removed to the Dominion Railway Commission, where he discharged his duty in a manner which others should at least emulate, if they cannot succeed in equalling his record."

"Not only is it a shock but it comes as a great personal loss to all of us," said J. E. Smith, chairman of the T. and N. O. Railway. "J. P. Mabey's death is a great loss to Canada."
