# CANADIANS' SPIRIT

Gen. Hughes Says He Can **Raise Three Contingents** Quickly.

ROSS RIFLE IS RETAINED

Kitchener's Cable Denies Any Intention of Rejecting the Arms.

Special to The Advertiser.] OTTAWA, Feb. 25 .- That Canada can supply Kitchener with three more contingents within three weeks was declared to Parliament today by General Hughes. Sir Wilfrid Laurier asked as to the progress of recruiting and the statement came in General Hughes' answer. There was considerable ap-plause from the Liberal side and Sir answer. There was considerable applause from the Liberal side and Sir Wilfrid Laurier and Hon G. P. Graham briefly affirmed that it was the duty of the hour in Canada that patriotism should be patriotically supported by contingents of Canadlan troops and Canadian supplies.

Every Member Stirred. When General Hughes replied that everywhere men were rallying and that recruiting was most satisfactory, the whole House cheered. Six hundred and fifty men for the cavalry had at one point been enlisted within six hours. Within 24 hours Eastern Ontario had more than provided the quota called for. more than provided the quota called for. There were places where enlistment had been reported slow, but this was due to the fact that the officials at these points under inspection had discouraged enlistment for the time, because equip-ment for soldiers could not be ob-tained fast enough. Today every regi-ment in Canada was up to full scrength.




