defendant. No objection was voiced by Mr. W. M. Charlton, acting for Pointing out the seriousness of the harge of escaping from custody and of assaulting a police officer the magistrate expressed the opinion that it was rather through ignorance than criminal intent that the chief had committed the offences. He therefore allowed him to go on suspended senence. Two sureties to the sum of \$200 will have to be furnished, however, to quarantee the Indian's good behavior

in the future. In addition he was or-dered to report to Chief of Police Donnelly every month for the next two years. In passing sentence Magistrate Blake stated that had the defendant been a white man and acquainted with the laws of the country he would have felt inclined to impose a sen-tence of one year in jail. "Perhaps, though, said the court, "if my ancestors had roamed this country for hundreds of years I would have felt as this man did—that he had a right
