LONDON, July 7.—The Liberals are in better spirits to-night. They have gained six more seats in to-day's pollings, and have succeeded in defeating a Cabinet Minister, Mr. Ritchie, President of the Local Government Board. The corrected totals at midnight show that 141 Conservatives and 19 Liberal Unionists have been elected, making the Tory strength 160 in all. The Liberals elected 116; the Irish anti-Parnellite Nationalists, 10, and the Parnellites 1. The Irish Home Rule strength therefore, counting the Labor candidates and Irish Nationalists, anti-Parnellites and Parnellites, is 127 against the 186 of the Tory Unionists.

ARRIVED FROM ALASKA.

What a U. S. P. O. Inspector Knows of the Seizure of the Coquitlam.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 7.—E. O. Inspector Seybold has returned to the city after the 21st of May, going direct to Seattle, and left there on the steamer Topka, a week later, for Sitka, arriving at the latter place on June 5. The mail steamer Elsie was secured at this point and the trip made these points once a month, carrying the mails and making about five stops. The most important stops she makes are Kodiak and Karluk. In speaking of mail service facilities in Alaska Mr. Seybold stated that the Government is about as good as could be expected, considering the fact that there were only two post offices on the route.

HOMESTEAD'S HORROR.

The Miners Still Determined and the End Not Yet Apparent.

Estimates of the Killed and Wounded—Pinkerton's Terrible Set Back.
