**GLIMPSES OF CAMPBELLTON TO KOREA VIA PACIFIC**

The word, "the very name suggests much. The vast dimension from sea to sea, and the broad expanse of sky so mysterious and endless. Developing the whole; the seasons, with their changing scenes of vegetation and loveliness, is apt to awaken awe and admiration in the soul of man. Not altogether from the splendor which he beholds, but from the consciousness that a mind inconceivably great, devised and brought into existence a world that will last till the appointed time.

Travelling from Canada to San Francisco, the scenery varies many respects. In some instances Nature is left to herself, while in other instances the proverb, "God hath made man upright, but he has sought out every invention," is fully realized, as one views numerous vehicles for rapid travelling and machinery to make work less laborious. America, the most aggressive country on the globe, where schools and colleges abound, every opportunity is given the eager seeker of knowledge to satisfy his longing desires. Books are sometimes placed at his disposal. There are opportunities to accumulate wealth, but above all in the great land which we call Canada and the United States, the Bible is an open book, which is treasure greater than silver or gold, the Gospel is proclaimed. Queen Victoria, when asked by a visitor, wherein lay the secret of England's greatness, replied—placing her hand on the Bible—"This is the secret of England's greatness." Truly it can be said of

to them by American missionaries. The large majority at the present time are foreigners, such as Japanese, Chinese, Koreans and Portuguese, with their tenets of worship, but the Catholic church is the predominant one. The city is not minus schools and colleges the principal one founded seventy years ago, at first was a boarding school for the children of missionaries, but has since become a college to fit students for American universities.

Although it cannot be said that the Hawaiian Islands are entirely foreign since their annexation to the United States yet the need for missionaries of the Gospel is great, because of the majority of incoming foreigners that are practically heathen.

Wending our way again with some reluctance to the ships' docks, we find nine native boys on board, ready to leap into the harbor for the purpose of obtaining silver money thrown over board to them by the passengers. They are expert swimmers and divers, seemingly at home in the water as well as on land, and will follow a ship for a great distance if there is the least possibility of obtaining nickels or dimes, which often times fall to the bottom of the sea before they can reach the spot, and which they pack in their mouths for safe keeping.

When they have secured all the money passengers are willing to throw in the sea they return to the ship swimming at a rapid rate while the ship proceeds on her way to a country slightly different in many respects from Japan with its teeming population and social customs.

Arriving at the docks Sunday morning, we went to the shore in a motor pan, which is a large almost flat boat propelled by one oar, and seized the opportunity to attend service in an interdenominational church, under the auspices of the American and British Bible Societies. Sitting in the pew while the church bell rang clear and long there seemed to be a sort of solemnity pervading the atmosphere, and notwithstanding the realization of heathen surroundings the great thought, "Surely the Lord is in this place," seemed to be uppermost.

During our short stay at the various ports, the natives swarmed to the docks with their ribbons, eager to take the foreigners, as they call them, on sight seeing excursions, with the end in view that a little more cash will be added to their possessions. The ribbons are just large enough to carry one passenger and look like a two wheeled gig, but are very much smaller. The ribbons most wear a certain style of harness which enables them to pull the vehicle and they walk or trot along as they are directed by the occupant, and will often travel to several miles without a single stop. The Japanese are very proud of their country and as far as scenery and landscape goes, they are very keenly interested in what they should see; many places are sacred to them and they look at foreigners with a suspicious eye, especially if they carry kodaks. Recently Japanese law has been passed forbidding a foreigner to take snapshots of the country without the permission of an official, who may consent once in a while very reluctantly.

To many of the Japanese an American or British subject is an object of curiosity, and considered to be queer specimens of humanity; we (Continued on page six)

waiting for the word of God, and will gather and where he says:

Mr. Sanford was wrestling with a large mass of correspondence when interrupted by the reporter's visit.
