Constantinople, Aug. 11-Reports ere today indicate that the great earthquake which was felt through a great part of Turkey yesterday was companied by much heavier loss of life than at first stated. The newspapers today estimated the number of victims at a thousand killed, while the injured are said to number from five to six thousand.
