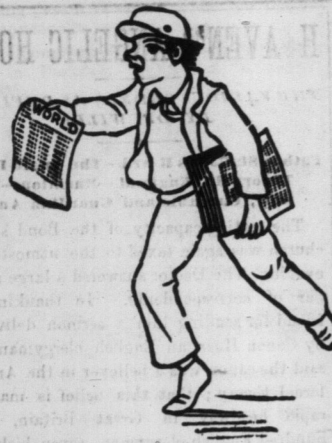

WORKINGMEN AND THE FRANCHISE. A few plain words on the question of the franchise are suggested by the platform of the workingmen.
